Restricted Registration Pilot Program**

**Resident Physician with Restricted Registration (RPRR)**

1. A RPRR working for the Division of Medical Oncology will be:
  1. At the level of PGY2 or above
  2. Have successfully completed a rotation in medical oncology
  3. Expected to have ACLS skills as necessary to acute ill patients at the physician level
  
2. The RPRR will have:
  1. Supervision directly by a staff Medical Oncologist who is available by telephone, and on site as necessary, 24 hours a day, 7 days per week.
  2. Additional on site emergency coverage is available by the internal medicine service, ICU RACE (Rapid Assessment of Critical Events) team, and TOH Code team.
  3. Standardized admission orders, protocols and learning materials for oncology admissions
  
3. Duties of an RPRR are as follows:
  1. Hours:
    - Weeknight call coverage (Mon-Fri) 1700-0800hrs
    - Weekend call coverage (Sat or Sun or holidays) 0800-0800hrs
  2. Must be able to present to the hospital within 15 minutes of a call, he/she will have the option to do call from home
  3. Cover the Division of Medical Oncology Inpatient Service TOH General Campus, Medical Oncology outpatients in TOH General Campus Medical Day Care Unit, and referrals to the service from TOH General Campus Emergency Room
  4. All admissions will be reviewed with the staff oncologist on call.
  5. Report and review with staff oncologist on call any unexpected serious medical problems or deaths on the service
  6. Provide handover to the attending staff or delegate physician after completing a call shift
  7. If doing weekend/holiday call, he/she will attend work rounds during the daytime hours with the staff oncologist
